SCIENCE

On Monday 15 September at 1.30 Greg Barnes will talk about two things.

First 'The Maths of Life and Death', where amongst other things he will show us the maths behind the screening for breast cancer and how this screening test can create a fair bit of angst particularly when you get a false positive (i.e., the result says you have breast cancer but in fact you don't have breast cancer) - and getting a false positive happens a fair bit in the screening process.
