Digital COVID Certificate – Smart Phones

For those of us who have one, we all have to use the Services Victoria App on our smart phones when we check in to any venue. It may also come to the stage where we may be required to present proof of COVID vaccination.

The Services Victoria App has now been up-dated to allow a digital copy of proof of vaccination.

This requires an ability to access the MyGov site. It also requires access to Medicare which has been linked to your MyGov account. This **must** be done to have the vaccine certification on your phone.

There are issues for those who have an android phone that is more than five years old, or for those with an iPhone not operating on ios 11 or beyond – it just won't install onto the phone, so those owners will have to sign in to every shop/venue as well as carrying a printed copy of your immunisation History.

The basic steps are:

1. You **MUST** have set up online access to your MyGov account
2. You **MUST** have linked your Medicare to your MyGov
3. You **MUST** have the latest version of the Services Victoria App installed on your phone
4. Click on the link from the Services Victoria App to take you to MyGov via the browser on your phone
5. Once into MyGov, scroll to the Link 'Proof of Vaccination – Go to Medicare'
6. Click on 'View History'
7. Scroll to, and click on 'Share with check in app'
8. Click on Share with Victoria Services App and agree to the rest of the following screens.

To have an offline copy of your vaccination certificate, it can be done using the above steps, using 'Add to Apple Wallet' (if using an iPhone).

[For those with an Android phone, I think there is the ability to save it to Google Pay]

If you have the Medicare Express Plus app on your phone, it can be stored here as an offline item.


I am prepared to assist members in having this set up. It would mean working with small groups of 4-5 at a time. Because we are all at different stages of being set up I would need to

know how far along the track you are – the online MyGov and Medicare links are essential, so if necessary I would have to help set that up before proceeding to the steps of linking to the Victoria Services app.

SETTING FAVOURITES IN THE VICTORIA SERVICES APP

Did you know you can save yourself a bit of time by setting up favourites in the check-in?

1. With the latest version of the app, there are three boxes on the bottom of the screen – History, COVID certificate and Check-in.
2. If you have recently visited a venue, click on the History Icon
3. Click on the Name you want to add as a favourite
4. On the bottom right-hand corner of the screen is a slider to select as a favourite – slide to show the green bar
5. Click on the back arrow (top left) and close to get back to the main screen.



6. You now have a link to click on to avoid having to go through the scanning process each time.

If you have a place that is not already in your History, you should now be offered the opportunity to add it as a favourite when you make your initial check-in.

If any members require assistance, please contact me and I will arrange sessions at the U3A hall. Sessions to commence after Monday, November 15 to allow MyGov setup beforehand if possible.

The topic for the November 15th Science matters is “Inventions and discoveries that have changed the world”.

History is made not only by kings, queens, presidents, and generals, but equally by inventors and the technological powers their inventions and discoveries unleash. The talk will discuss the inventions and discoveries that have changed the world— from prehistoric times to the 21st century. Along with recounting famous inventions, such as the steam engine, the aeroplane, the atomic bomb and the computer chip, we will look at a number of surprising innovations, including beer, pagodas, indoor plumbing, and department stores. We will look at how early inventions were used to stimulate trade, fight wars, and create empires.

Finally, it's on to the inventions that have shaped everyday life in the 20th and 21st century, including the Model T, domestic appliances, electronics, and the Internet.
